Piero della Francesca was a 14th Century renowned Italian Painter who was blind. His painting of Christ's Baptism is considered a classic. He represents every detail visually to remind us what Baptism is. He has a tree to the left of painting with an axe alongside reminding all, should it be cut down or not, warning us of the responsibilities of Baptism. A man in the river struggles to take off his shirt as Jesus is being baptized showing us as Jesus is with us in Baptism, he is always alongside us in life as he is at his Baptism. The Dove is radiantly white above Jesus head expressing the supernatural. The event is solemn and serious, man being touched by God, God manifesting His Being to man.
