Pope Francis to the U.S. Pope Francis message to the U.S. is one he has lived by the slums of Argentina. Be humble, passionate concern for the poor, any who are excluded, the immigrants, people who suffer, bring morals into economic policies, poverty, war, climate change, arms trade. Be a church non-judgmental, merciful, devotion to family life. Work for the common good, not just the individual good. Live compassionately and be a missionary church that includes not excludes people. Love as God loves.

Junipero Serra (Part 9 of 15) 1750 Serra worked in Sierra Gorda, north of Mexico City to convert the Pames Indians. Ten years he would labor here with little success. Language was always a problem. The Pames Indians spoke Spanish, practiced agriculture, and would not be colonized by Spain. Likewise, they did not want to live in mission grounds, the system the Spanish Crown approved to organize the Indians, as Jalpaj Mission where Serra worked. Only in times of crisis did the Pames Indians come to the mission. There is no evidence Serra baptized large number of Indians in Sierra Gorda.
