Junipero Serra (Part 14 of 15) In the building of Missions, good land was ovulated, soil, water, timber, trees for shade, pasturage, harbors, before a Mission site was selected. The Indians went about naked which greatly bothered Serra. The Missions successfully had large numbers of cattle, grew corn, flour, chocolate, figs, raisins, and vines; also pottery works, metal works, weaving. The Missions were defended by Spanish soldiers. Periodically ships from Mexico would bring supplies to the Missions. There were never enough padres to run the Missions. Many friars were not willing to travel that far west where no Christians had gone before. The Missions were attacked, friars and anglos killed. Not everyone welcomed the European colonizers.
