**SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT – YEAR C**

Bar 5:1-9; Ps 126:1-6; Phil 1:3-6, 8-11; Lk 3:1-6

As we continue our Advent journey, waiting for Jesus to come at Christmas, John the Baptist calls us to prepare the way – the highway – to get ready for the Lord to enter our lives.

We see many highways or freeways nowadays. But very interestingly, there had been highways in Palestine before Jesus' time, or more than 2000 years ago. People of Israel were able to build a nearly-four-hundred-mile road called King's Highway which went through the country; it is the major north-south route, east of the Jordan River, mentioned in the Book of Numbers (Num 20:17). People at that time did not have cars as we have today. They only traveled by camels, horses, oxen, or on foot. However, the King's Highway was a main road which helped people to travel easier.

When I went back to visit Vietnam the first time after 15 years away from home, I was amazed by new constructions everywhere: houses, office buildings, roads, bridges, and highways. Growing up in a poor village in Vietnam, I had never seen a highway. Land was covered in hills and valleys; and the old roads were twisted. But now, people have filled in the valleys, leveled the hills and generally made the roads straight and wider. There is a highway running through my home town, that helps people to travel faster and easier.

From today's gospel, John the Baptist fulfills the prophecy of Prophet Isaiah. He urges people to prepare the way for the Lord, fill in the valleys and level the mountains to clear a straight path for the Lord to come. We can see from the image of a highway, not only in physical meaning, but also in spiritual sense. We can play with the word: "Highway" means not-a-low-way. As people of God, we are reminded to seek whatever comes from "above" not from "below."

John the Baptist is the forerunner of Christ Jesus; he comes to call us to repentance: "prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths," to change our lives to please God – the one who loves us into happiness.

What hills need to be leveled? Let us make low the hill of our anger and hatred. Maybe there is someone whom we find it difficult to get along with; or maybe we have not talked with some relative for a long time. Now is time to level that hill – to make peace with people we don't like; we pray for reconciliation and forgiveness.

What valleys need filling in? Maybe it is the coldness of our hearts to God's love; or maybe our indifference to people who suffer. Let us now spend a little more time in prayer and allow God to fill our hearts with love. Maybe we could do some act of charity for someone in real need, such as giving more generously in this Advent season, as an intention of our sacrifice, to prepare the room in our hearts for Jesus as Christmas is coming. Maybe we can do something we feel God is calling us to do at home with our family or neighbors. Whatever it is, we are called to fill in that valley.

There are many other ways we can prepare our hearts and souls for the Lord, but most importantly, we are called to build the way for Jesus in our hearts and in the hearts of those around us so our communication with God is clearer.

Today let us build our highway to Jesus and for Jesus. Seek what is above, not what is below. Let us ask the Lord to grant us spiritual strength, to fill the valley of our sins. Make the rugged land of our soul a plain of peace. Make the rough country of our heart a broad valley of love. Create in our home, in our community, a world of love and peace for God's kingdom to come.
